## PREFACE

This Memorial Issue, as announced in the previous volume of the Boletín de la Sociedad Matemática Mexicana, is dedicated to the memory of the late Professor José Adem, friend and mentor of the Mexican mathematical community and founder of the Second Series of the Boletín.

After Dr. Adem's passing on February 14, 1991, invitation letters requesting original research papers were sent on behalf of the editorial committee of the Boletín, mainly to topologists and algebraists, but also to many other mathematicians that had some relation with José Adem or his work. We thank all the contributors that responded to our invitation to participate in this memorial issue, which after considerable delay we are pleased to offer to the mathematical community.

Partial financial support was provided by the Centro de Investigación y de Estudios Avanzados del Instituto Politécnico Nacional (CINVESTAV-IPN) and the Consejo Nacional de Ciencia y Tecnología (CONACyT). I give thanks particularly to Feliciano Sánchez Sinencio and Onésimo Hernández-Lerma, respectively Director of the CINVESTAV-IPN and Head of the Mathematics Department.
